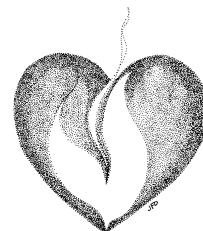

March Food Share Month --- Hunger Facts:

- One in ten Minnesotans experience food insecurity.
- 13.8% of children in Minnesota are food insecure.
- About 10% of Minnesotans (12.7% of children) were in poverty in 2016.3
- Over 3,000,000 visits were made to Minnesota food shelves *each year*, 2011-2016, and visits in 2017 were on pace to likely meet or exceed this number.
- The number of food insecure seniors and seniors utilizing food shelves continues to increase.

Definitions:

- **Food security** is "access by all people at all times to enough food for an active, healthy life."
- **Food insecurity** means access to adequate food is inconsistent and limited by a lack of money and other resources throughout the year. Food insecure households report their diets to be of reduced quality, variety, or desirability and/or experience disrupted eating patterns and reduced food intake.

Financial Counseling for farmers in distress

It can be helpful to talk with someone who can directly address financial stress. The University of Minnesota Extension offers farm financial counseling. If you or a farmer you know is experiencing financial stress, contact the Farm Information Line at **(800) 232-9077** to set up a financial counseling appointment.

Financial counseling is free and completely confidential. A team of Extension farm financial analysts has been assembled of retired experts from areas like banking and farm business management education to provide free, one-on-one financial counseling to farmers who are experiencing financial stress. These analysts will help participating farmers understand their financial situation, explore options and seek to identify alternatives to help alleviate the financial stress caused by the current agricultural climate.

The circumstances we are facing right now as farmers are challenging, but turning to others for help is a strong first step in the right direction. Taking care of yourself is always important.
